

50 Items Every Emergency Tool Kit Should Have

Quantity is dependent on number of employees and estimated number of visitors or customers.

General Supplies

- Work gloves, leather
- Latex gloves
- Safety goggles
- O First aid kit
- Pressure dressings
- O Paper cups, small
- Crowbar
- Space blankets
- O Tarp or ground cover
- O Pens & paper
- Whistle
- Antibiotic ointment
- 1 gallon of water per person, per day, for three days

- Micro-fleece blanket
- O Duct tape (for sealing doors & windows)
- Scissors
- O Flashlight & batteries
- Utility shut off wrench
- Fire extinguisher
- Non-perishable food items
- Portable radio, batteries or other communication system
- Suitable container for supplies (5-gallon bucket or backpack)
- Toilet supplies (large bucket, used as container for supplies and toilet when needed, with plastic bags, toilet paper, and hand washing supplies)



First Aid Supplies

- 4 x 4" compress
- 0 8 x 10" compress
- Elastic bandage
- Triangular bandage
- Cardboard splints
- Butterfly bandages
- Hydrogen peroxide
- O Bleach, small bottle
- Stretcher or backboard
- Scissors, paramedic
- Tweezers, assorted
- Triage tags
- Latex gloves
- Oval eye patches
- Tape: 1" & 2" cloth
- Dust masks
- Disposable blankets
- First aid books, standard and advanced
- Space blankets
- Heavy duty rubber gloves

Sanitation Supplies

- One toilet kit per 100 employees/customers, to include:
- 1 portable toilet
- 1 privacy shelter
- 20 rolls toilet paper
- 300 wet wipes
- 300 plastic bags with ties
- 10 large plastic trash bags
- Soap and water, in addition to the wet wipes, is strongly advised
